






07-07-2018 Vaachmaram and Aanakkayam colony visits.

Bipin, a BPed student of our college suffered an injury during a match due to which he had to undergo an urgent CT scan and approached us for a financial assistance of Rs. 2000 for the same. We were glad to have helped him on time.

Thoravangadu resident Maimoonath approached us for a financial assistance of 2500 INR. She is suffering from kidney failure and is undergoing a dialysis every alternative day in a week. This money was for her injections that was urgently prescribed by the Doctor.

Boban, who lost one of his legs during an accident 9 years back approached us for financial help since he could no more go for a job and his wife was also out of any job now. Since his urgent requirement was the replacement of his walking stick, our volunteers immediately bought the new set of walking stick with the fund released from Thavanish the very same day. He was sent back to his home with a grocery kit of Rs. 500 accompanied by 2 of our volunteers.



Thavanish conducted the Onam-Bakrid Kit Distribution and National Health Senior Citizens Survey Forms' handing-over ceremony at the College Auditorium. 200 eligible families of Muriyadu Panchayath were handed over grocery kits worth Rs. 500 by Irinjalakuda MLA Mr. Arun Master at the event presided by Principal Dr. Mathew Paul Ukken. Along with this, the forms of the National Health Senior Citizens Survey conducted at Muriyadu Grama Panchayath were handed over to Irinjalakuda Block Panchayath Vice President Mrs. Nalini Balachandran.

Kerala Floods 2018

Due to the worsened weather conditions across different parts of Kerala and increasing number of relief camps, Thavanish, social welfare and charity organization of Christ College, Irinjalakuda set up a collection and distribution center on 15th august 2018 for catering basic items for different flood relief camps. The distribution center started receiving rice, clothes, groceries and other basic items on 16th august 2018 followed by the initiation of a relief camp at the college due to the worsened situation in the neighboring areas. The first family from Chalakudy arrived around evening followed by different families from Chalakudy, Kaattor, Aaraattupuzha, Mala, Muriyadu and Padiyoor amounting to approximately 1100 people. Thavanish volunteers, NSS volunteers, union members, staffs, hostellers, other students, social workers, common people and medical organizations contributed tremendously in making this an efficient and useful collection and distribution center for flood relief camps. District judge, Judiciary First class magistrate and Deputy Tahsildar including the revenue government department marked their exemplified support and cooperation. The prominent actor Tovino Thomas and other Aluminites of our college were successfully able to perform rescue operations of about 500 families who were stuck at Karalam, Vallivattam, Pothani and Padiyoor due to the flood.

Principal Dr. Mathew Paul Ukken, vice principal Rev. Fr. Jolly Andrews CMI, Rev. Fr. Joy Peenikkaparambil CMI, and Prof. V. P. Anto provided excellent guidance and monitoring to ensure smooth and disciplined working of the distribution center and the camp. Thavanish staff coordinator Prof. Muvish Murali was in charge of the distribution center and Prof. Sony of the BPed department was in charge of the relief camp. The sports mentor. Dr. B.P. Aravindan was appointed as the coordinator of our relief camp at Christ Vidyanikethan School too. Discipline committee convener Dr. Anil Kumar, staff Dr. T. Vivekanandhan, Economics department professor P.R. Bose, Economics department staff Sister rosy and Shanti, NSS coordinator Prof. Arun Balakrishnan, Commerce department staff Prof. Jebin K Davis and Smitha Antony, Library office staff Sister Jincy

were among the staff who marked their heavy authorities from the relief camps. The necessary items for our camps were also met sufficiently from the collection center. Due to the successful and effective working of the collection and distribution center, we were able to receive a lot of items based on the requirements of different camps and were also able to distribute the same for different relief camps eventually. The items were distributed after checking the signatures and seal of concerned officers of our panchayat. They also sponsored a "sadhya" on the occasion of Onam for all the inmates of our camp.

- * 1600 people donated either cash or necessary requirements to our collection and distribution center.
- * Successfully catered the required things to approximately 200 camps within and outside the borders of Thrissur district.
- * 300 and above volunteers actively participated in a camp of 10 days.

















On September 29, Thavanish provided financial aid to little 'Devananda' for her eye treatment. Since the family found it hard to raise necessary fund for the same, they approached us. We handed over the financial aid to her family in the presence of principal Dr. Mathew Paul Ukken, Vice Principal Rev. Fr. Joy Peenikkaparambil CMI who spoke about the situation and their requirement for a financial support. Lejeesh is an auto driver at Pullur. Dr. Jolly Andrews CMI, Thavanish staff coordinator Prof. Muvish Murali and Thavanish volunteers.

Binoy is a heart patient from Chemmanda. His family approached Thavanish for financial assistance and we handed over the same to them. It is yet another happy moment for us to have contributed for a good cause in some way possible by us.

Maimoonath, the patient suffering from kidney failure had an urgent requirement of financial aid of for her tests. Due to the flood Maimoonath was not able to travel to Calicut where her dialysis was done, and had to do the same from Kodungalloor which required many tests and procedures. This required the urgent need of an amount which was difficult for them to find since they belonged to a very poor family and have spent already a lot of money for her dialysis since the past 6 years. We were glad that we could help them in whichever way possible by us.





As a part of Children's Day, Thavanish distributed notebooks to the students of Sangameshwara School, Irinjalakkuda. On serious thoughts of doing an innovative program for children's day, it hit us that there cannot be a better gift for a student than a notebook or stationery which will be of great aid for them. Financial aid to Sreerag

Sreerag is a student of our college belonging to the chemistry department. Post the Kerala Floods 2018, they lost their house and approached the Government for assistance to get back their shelter. It was then noticed that their land actually belonged to the government. And due to this their house cannot be built there. Another option was to get a house allocated by Government and they got it allocated at Kasaragod which was very far and was not possible to shift easily. After enquiring with different concerned authorities of any possible option they were informed that if they could manage to arrange a land Government would build house on that land. And for the same, Thavanish contributed 1 lakh rupees to Sreerag and his family for buying the land. 70000 rupees was given to Thavanish by the Alumni Association of 2007-10 Commerce batch and 30000 was arranged from Thavanish's fund. The cheques were handed over to Sreerag by the Principal, Vice Principals, Thavanish Coordinator Prof. Muvish Murali and other staff along with Thavanish volunteers at the Principal's office.
